



### Lesson Plan



#### Torch:

The torch is held in her right hand to light the way to liberty and freedom. Also, the basket that surrounds the flame is symbolic of America's Native American past, including spearheads and corn, which is an American staple crop.



#### Crown:

The statue wears a crown with seven spikes. This represents the 7 seas and 7 continents of the world.



#### Tablet:

The Statue holds a tablet in her left hand. The date of America's independence is on the tablet (JULY IV MDCCLXXVI). The tablet is in the shape of a keystone. When an arch is built the keystone is the stone which keeps the others together.



#### Robe:

The Statue is dressed in a traditional Greco-Roman robes, the clothing free people wore in ancient Greece or Rome.

### **Broken Chains:**

Located at the Statue's feet symbolize the American's freedom.

### My Liberty Budget

Students can learn the value of budgeting money as if they were a new immigrant living in the United States of America. Tell them the average yearly income in the early 1900's was \$800 dollars a year. \$8 a week for men, \$2 week for women, and pennies a day for children who would be found working to help support their families when they were as young as six years old. They would work up to 16 hours a day!

It was common for a child your age to contribute to the work and income of the family in 1910. You would even be responsible to help in the payment of bills. Look at the list of expenses for the average household in the year 1910 and record your families personal expenses on the table below. Your families weekly salary is eleven dollars a week. There are several payments that must be made before you spend on personal entertainment, wants, or needs. You **MUST** pay the **rent, buy coal** (it is the middle of January), **eggs, milk and bread**.


